From THE DIRECTOR

Hello, welcome to CPT and our unique production of The Curious Incident! My journey with this play began 5 years ago after seeing the tour at the Ahmanson where I vividly remember walking out and thinking, "That was a crazy wild time... that's the play I want to direct next." As a director, I am always looking for something edgy, new and challenging; so of course, I promptly began submitting this play to CPT. While waiting for approval and a slot in the season to open up, I grew impatient (surprising, I know) and thought to myself, "Is this a play that I could direct with my students at school? Could they rise to the occasion? Could we do the piece justice?" So, in the Spring of 2019, my advanced class did a table read and just like that myself and 15 teenagers began what seemed like "mission impossible."

I decided that if we are going to go big, we might just rent a theater as well, so we booked out a week at Studio Theatre Playhouse on Riverside Drive, just down the street from our school, ESAT. This meant that we were now a "traveling" production so I needed to create a concept that was portable and light enough to lift/stack, but sturdy enough to climb on, roll and configure all while amplifying the world of the play. This was a lot to accomplish on my own, so I told a close friend, Julie Hackett, about what I was doing and she graciously agreed to join the team and become our "boxographer." (But really, it's complicated; just wait and see :-)) The show that you are about to witness has taken the bones from the 2019 production and put them into hyperdrive, using every inch of the theatre possible and all of the tech at our disposal.

This play is about real people and represents the challenges and triumphs in life that most people experience. Heartache, excitement, joy, wonder, adventure, doubt, stress and conflict; you name it, it's there. My hope is that you walk away from this production with many thoughts, aspirations and dreams of your own adventures and how you can help other people in their daily journey of life. I would like to dedicate this production to my students of the 2019 production who helped pave the way for something even better to be created and shared with this community. Thank you for spending your time with us today, we hope that you enjoy our production and that you can spread the word about the incredible work that the volunteers do at CPT.
