From THE DIRECTOR

If you ask most people what comes to mind when they think of 9 to 5, they will likely touch on the same few things: a fun comedy about a chauvinist boss who is inappropriate with his female employees. They will likely remember the wonderful casting of Dolly Parton, Lily Tomlin, Jane Fonda, and Dabney Coleman, and possibly even the silly marijuana-induced fantasy scenes where the ladies dream about how they would get rid of the boss. Most will know it as a fun, frivolous story with an underlying message of women's empowerment.

I know that's what I thought of when asked to direct the show, but then I did some research, including watching the recent Netflix documentary, 9 to 5, The Story of a Movement, and found out how much I didn't know. While I had knowledge of the Women's Liberation movement and was aware of the huge inequities women faced in the workplace, whether salary and opportunity-related or just everyday treatment and respect, I had no idea that the title and many of the themes of the movie were actually based on 9 to 5 News, a newsletter that was first published in 1972 which subsequently led to the formation of Boston 9 to 5, a grassroots collective for women addressing the low pay and lack of opportunity for advancement in the workplace they were experiencing. Over time the group grew and merged with various organizations and unions to become 9 to 5, The National Association of Working Women. These women and their stories were the inspiration for the film, 9 to 5, and much of the reason life for women in the workplace has improved over the years.

I hope the audience enjoys the fun and humor of the show but also reflects on the power we all have to fix what isn't right, to make things better, and to stand up and fight for what we believe in - not just for women but for every marginalized group. I dedicate this show to the women of the 9 to 5 movement and to everyone who works so hard to bring positive change and equality into the world.
