Mission Statement

The mission of Conejo Players Theatre is to share in providing the community with a year-round schedule of affordable live theatre produced to serve the cultural, educational, and entertainment needs of the community; and to welcome and provide an avocational opportunity for all volunteers interested in the theatre arts to participate in the many activities of community theatre.

From THE DIRECTOR

You would be hard-pressed to go anywhere in the world where *Romeo and Juliet* isn't known either as a film, opera, ballet, or as you will see tonight, a play. I can't imagine how many productions have been performed since it first premiered in 1596 at the Curtain Theatre just outside of London with Richard Burbage playing Romeo opposite Master Robert Goffe as Juliet. Since then, these two title characters have proven to be an exciting challenge for generations of actors – transcending any language or cultural barrier.

Placing our version in 1935 in Verona, Mississippi (yes, it really does exist) proved to be a comfortable fit for the story, the lyricism of the language, and the characters' world. With feuds often breaking out over land rights and property lines in this agricultural society it isn't hard to imagine how the Montague and Capulet families have been pulled into a generational feud. Add to that the hot, humid days of July; the gloom of the Great Depression; and the personal fortunes of each family having been depleted, and the stage is now set for the tale to unfold.

For me music serves as another character in a play. This production is steeped in Mississippi Delta Blues and Big Band music from the 1930's; and for Romeo and Juliet's dance I was thrilled to be able to use a 1932 recording of the Tom Gerun Orchestra featuring my grandfather, Frank McMinn, on trumpet!

As you watch the play tonight, it's important to remember that the story takes place over a relatively short time span, beginning on a Sunday morning and ending very early on the following Thursday. I've staged it so that you'll get a sense of this swift time sequence that serves as a driving force behind why decisions are made haphazardly, mistakes are quickly compounded, and good intentions turn into tragedy...or do they?

I, along with our producer and very talented cast, have strived to make the language, characters and situations written in the 1590's relatable for today's audience. The people you'll meet are colorful, complex and sometimes very flawed, in a story that is as relevant today as it was then. I hope our production brings you a renewed enjoyment and appreciation for *Romeo and Juliet* as it's presented in a way you have never seen before.


