From THE DIRECTOR

Picture it: in 1979, a little girl gets her very own white record player with its own case and handle and three brand new albums: *Annie, Cats,* and *A Chorus Line*. You could even find all the lyrics on the inside sleeve. By that point I had been taking dance for three years and I was in love with dancing. But those albums were a game changer. It started my love for musical theatre; *A Chorus Line,* especially. First, trying to figure out what dance moves they were talking about. "Step kick kick leap kick touch. Again." and hearing "A 5-6-7-8!" Making up all kinds of renditions of what it might be and creating a cool jazz number in my head. Then listening to the other songs, obviously all the innuendo completely over my head. Like, "what's wrong with "Playing Doctor With Evelyn?" yet knowing that "Tits And Ass" was naughty. Hee hee.

And really connecting with Morales as she described "Mr. Karp's acting class." I, too, was in an acting class trying to be an ice cream cone and not knowing how to do that. Then my heart swelling as I listened to "At the Ballet," just knowing how all my problems went away when I was on stage or watching a performance. Feeling Cassie's passion and understanding the special relationship I had with "The Music And The Mirror." Finally, the climax "One." I can still feel what it was like to memorize all those patter words and get them just perfect.

But, as amazing as my imagination was, when I finally got to see it on Broadway at the age of 15 with my brother, Dan and other dancers, I was glued to my seat. Finally I found out what that "Step kick kick leap kick touch. Again." meant. Realizing the depth that this journey and these characters went through. I remember being in tears when Paul opens up. Especially during that time when I had family members coming out to an unwelcoming world. Finally, seeing that big closing number all in gold, with the hats, the precision, the perfection, and the big climax.

A Chorus Line had and still has a deep impact on me and I know, on an untold number of dancers and artists all over the world. After 50 years, even done in its 1970's fashion is still so relative to the journey of an artist. I am honored to be directing and choreographing this pivotal piece that has meant so much to me and many others through the decades. I have been tasked with staying true to the original intent of the piece and honoring some of the original choreography while bringing my own creativity and interpretation of the writing and the music to life. The ambitious hard-working cast that is a part of this project blows me away on a daily basis. Of course, none of it can be accomplished without the talent, dedication and behind the scenes magic of our production crew. This piece is a testament of "What We Did For Love."
